**Town Board Meeting Minutes**

The Clerk, Treasurer and all members of the Board were present along with Bob Gerbers, and other members of the community. The Clerk indicated that the meeting was properly noticed; the agenda was presented after the pledge of allegiance was recited.

**Minutes from March 19, 2018 Town Board Meeting, after any corrections have been rectified. M/M by Supervisor Meeuwesen to approve the minutes from the March 19, 2018 Town Board Meeting; with no corrections. Seconded by Supervisor Lasee. Motion carried.**

**Rockland Roads Tour**

All board members agreed to set two dates for the road tour in the event Greg from Scott Construction was not able to make the first one. First Date, Friday, April 27th at noon for four hours. A backup date of Friday, May 11th, also at noon was also agreed on. The Clerk will relay these dates to Greg for confirmation from him.

**Finalization of the 2017 Annual Report.**

All board members had the opportunity to review the information as presented. No issues were apparent and all approved it for publication.

**Reports and Updates**

**Building Inspection Report – Bob Gerbers**

Bob reviewed the activity for the month of March. He issued one permit for a pool on Windchime. Bob stated that he spoke with Steve Van Handel trying to get the lot on HWY 57 cleaned up again. It appears that the mess and junk will be a constant struggle until this renter moves out. Bob asked Chairman Cashman to talk to the county about moving the curve sign on Solitude as it is now too close to the homeowners driveway.

**Treasurer's Report – Mary Van Dyke**

Mary indicated that the last of the personal property taxes was collected today. Dog licenses continue to trickle in. She presented her financial report. There were no questions.

M/M by Chairman Cashman to accept the financial report as presented. Seconded by Supervisor Lasee. Motion carried.

**Chairman's Report – Dennis Cashman**

*Should* With the coming snow, Chairman Cashman called Carter and reminded them to *Keep* take the wings off the snow plows so as to not damage the aprons. Jay will come though the town hall parking lot to keep it clear for voters.

Chairman Cashman noted that the Willems property over on PP is mess again. The neighbor's residence is also looking bad. It is thought that Willem's employee is responsible for some of the recent clutter.

There have been a few calls regarding weight limits. They are being handled on a case by case basis.

Two holes are evident on Ledgecrest, south of Ledgeview Road, and in need of repair.

**Announcements and Distribution of Correspondence received, if any**

The sodium chloride order paperwork was received from Brown County and will require board action at the next meeting. The County is asking for storage inspections and for each municipality to take as much as storage will allow so there is more room at the dock. Order forms were provided to the board members for their review. At present, 75.01 tons of salt/sand mix are on hand, as well as 15.09 of salt. With more inclement weather, these stores will be depleted.

There will be a primary for the Special Election to fill Frank Lasee's seat. The filing deadline to run for the seat is Tuesday, April 17th, though according to the treasurer, a primary is already a necessity. Unfortunately, it will require a rescheduling of the Board of Review, also planned for May 15th. The Clerk will check with the Assessor for an alternate date. The Special Election will be held Tuesday, June 12th. It was suggested that the state should reimburse everyone for the delay in scheduling the elections since it could have been conducted with the spring elections.

**Items intended for future meetings**

The Planning Commission is expected to approve a request to create a new lot for Lynda Tetzlaff, splitting the buildings from the farmland. If approved, it will require a Public Hearing.

Joey Bratz, 3486 Eiler Road, requested the Town look at a speed limit reduction at the intersection of Big Valley and Eiler Road. Because of elevation, drivers can't see what's coming over the rise and often that results in close calls on that road, especially at the intersection. In addition, drivers have been exceeding the 55 mph and driving down the middle of the road. Chairman Cashman will investigate the possibility.

The Town's Association next dinner meeting is April 26th.

**Public Comment**

The check for the citation issued regarding dogs running loose has been paid.

A request to rent the tables and chairs from the town hall was made, and denied by the board.

The Clerk and Building Inspector have a conflict for the June 4th date as it is De Pere's High School Graduation that evening. The board will likely meet that evening and tape record the minutes, with the Treasurer filling in the motions for the Clerk.

**Adjournment**


